Miriam when she was hiding by the river with the baby Moses.

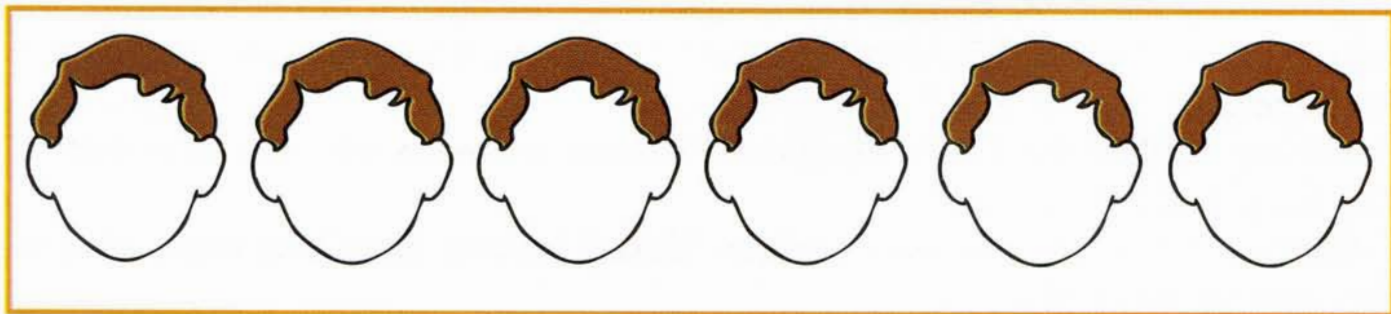
The princess when she found the baby in the special basket.

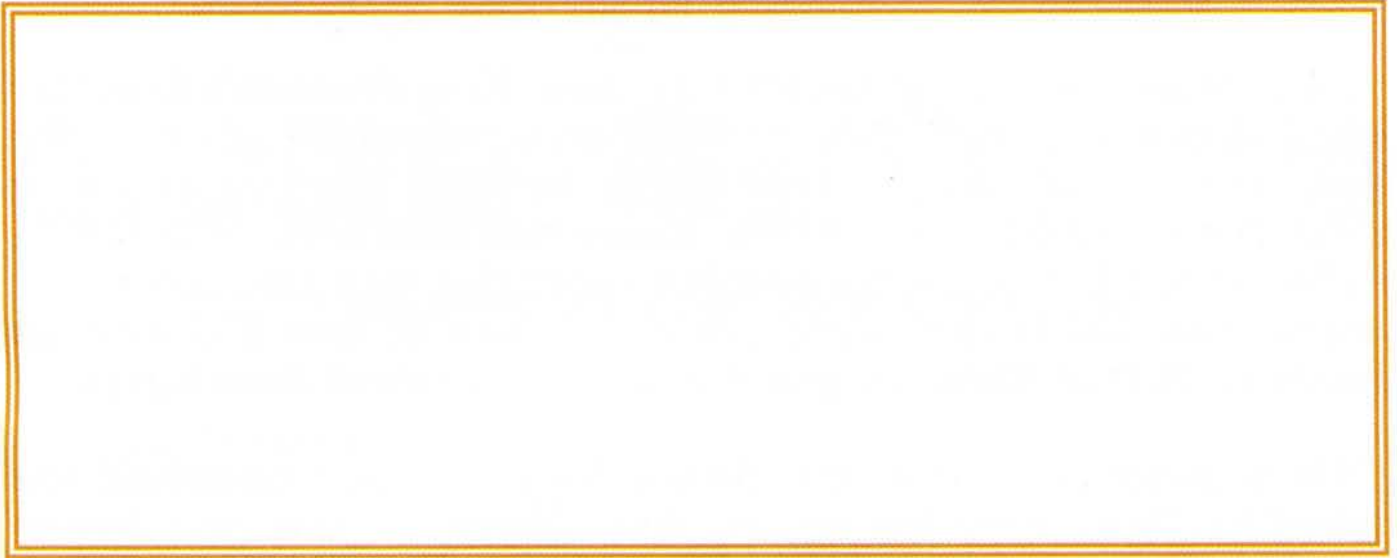

The First Commandment

Exodus 2:11-15; 3:10; 20:3

Baby Moses grew up in the king's palace. King Pharaoh's daughter loved Moses very much. When Moses grew older, he worked for the king. His job was to be a boss to the Israelite workers. The king treated the Israelites like slaves. Moses had been born an Israelite, so he did not like to see his people treated this way. One day he got angry with one of the king's guards because he saw him beat an Israelite. Moses killed the guard and then ran away from Egypt.

Many years later God sent Moses back to Egypt to get all the Israelites away from the wicked king. Moses led the Israelites to freedom. Then God gave Moses ten rules to teach the Israelites so they could learn to obey Him. God wrote them on tablets of stone.

The first rule said, "Thou shalt have no other gods before me." That means God wanted His children to learn to worship only Him.

God said, "I am the One who saved you from the wicked king." He did not want them to worship false gods or golden statues.

Moses taught the people to love and obey only God.
