

It makes sense to use these economical projects to make class the learning place it needs to be. Each learner can benefit from a correlated project to help him use the Bible principle and make a life application of it.


The assortment of projects in this quarter's collection gives learners interesting resources to take home. Prepare samples ahead of time as motivational incentives.

Time Saver Tip: when you get your new material, remove the sticker pages for all the make and take books for your class members and put them in a folder. Then, open the book in half and use a tabletop paper cutter to cut along the perforated line of the two sides. Repeat the process with each book. Then, separate the pages of all the books making a stack for each lesson. Put all the make and take pages for Lesson 1 in a file folder marked for that lesson. Place Lesson 2 pages in another folder and so on. Keep the folders in order in an expansion folder or plastic file box. Each week, place the folder used that day at the back of the file. The next lesson is always in front.

Children your age are great at thinking of nice things to do for others. In each frame draw a picture of something you will do for another person this week.






