WAKE UP! THE HARVEST IS READY!

In Matthew 9:34-38, Jesus teaches us a very important lesson. We must be awake and aware of the things that are going on around us. We cannot view things through the filter of how we want



them or wish them to be, but how they truly are. We are living in dark, difficult, and discouraging days. Many in our world are unchurched and the harvest truly is plenteous. There are people to reach! There are those across the oceans and in our backyards who need to hear the gospel. This is the most important work we must do, and it is the reason we exist. Despite the difficulties, what an exciting time to be alive! This is our time to do what God would have us to do! Churches are closing their doors, and the laborers are few. We all know the problem but what is the solution? As Jesus ministered, He met physical needs, but He could see deeper. He saw the heart of man and was moved with compassion or moved in the heart to do something about their condition. Jesus gives us three things we need to see and one thing we must do.

We Need to Wake Up and See the Plight of People. (Verse 36) Jesus looked past how we often see people and saw them how they really were. We put people in so many different physical classes and circles, but Jesus classifies people into two. There are lost sinners and saved sinners. He saw in their weariness that they were being beaten down by sin. He saw them scattered wondering aimlessly through life with no direction. People today are trying to get by the best they can. They have their hope in the government, the "American Dream," paydays, vacations, and good health. Jesus saw people without a shepherd and without hope. We desperately need to see people the way Jesus did and be moved with compassion. People are dealing with loneliness, fear, frustration and absolutely no fulfillment. Their greatest problem is their sin problem; their greatest need is to be saved, and their only hope is Jesus!

We Need to Wake Up and See the Potential of People. (Verse 37) Jesus looked at the crowds and saw a plenteous harvest. The disciples saw people who were angry, sick, and pushing to get help from Jesus. Jesus saw their spiritual problems and frustrations. He saw people who needed to be touched and transformed by His amazing grace. He saw their potential. It is not what a man is before he comes to Christ but what He can be after he comes to Christ. There is power in the name of Jesus, and He alone can change lives. The gospel we are privileged to share is a gospel for whosoever! The blood of Jesus is still good to reach the vilest sinner and set the captives free. The revival in Samaria happened because Jesus reached out to a woman no one wanted to have anything to do with. People near and far need Jesus! Politics will not get it done, religion cannot get it done, the world will not satisfy the people of this world, only Jesus!

We Need to Wake Up and See the Problem of Harvest. (Verse 37) The houses may be full, but the fields are empty. We need more workers, more disciples, and more missionaries. Reaping is hard work! We must get in the field and get dirty. We cannot wait for the harvest to come to us, but we must get busy and work in God's field. His field is here in the Bible belt, across the USA, in the deepest part of the jungles and in the cities and neighborhoods throughout the world. We see the need, but we must be willing to go.

We Must Wake Up and Realize the Power available. (Verse 38) Jesus gives only one command in this section of Scripture. The one thing He tells us to do here is pray! When we pray, we engage the power of Heaven. The work is God's, and He gives the increase. Would you join me in praying Matthew 9:38? May we pray for the lost to be saved! May we pray for the harvest to be great and more workers in the field. May we pray that we will catch a burning desire and passion and be moved to do more for the glory of God and say as Isaiah said, "Here am I, send me" (Isaiah 6:8).

That is why we are thankful for those who have answered the call and are carrying the gospel throughout the uttermost parts of the world. 

HARVEST PANAMA MISSION Chitre, Panama

My name is Mark Cimino, and my wife Marie and I have been called to Panama to spread the gospel of Jesus Christ. I accepted Jesus as my Lord and Savior in October of 2002. In 2004, I surrendered to the ministry and started serving at Harvest Oaks Baptist Church under the mentorship of Bro. Jay Gibson. In 2006, I held the position of outreach minister. I have led a Men's ministry and my wife and I led the Spanish ministry at Harvest Oaks. I was ordained in 2016 and accepted the position as associate pastor. Then, in 2022, the Lord opened some doors and allowed us to pursue what He had placed on our hearts years before (moving to the mission field in Panama). In February of this year, we started our journey driving from Allen, Texas to Chitre, Panama. 5 countries and



13 days later, we arrived in Chitre. It was an incredible journey! We saw God move and protect us each and every day. 5 souls were saved. Praise the Lord! 2 in Guatemala, 2 in Honduras, and 1 in Costa Rica.

We have now been in Panama for 6 months and the Lord has blessed us with a children's ministry. We have an average of 23 children from our neighborhood that meet at our house each week. We are seeing the Lord move in the lives of these children and praying it opens doors to start reaching their parents.



Chitre, Panama is made up of mostly lower to middle class Panamanian families with a population of 60,000. 90% of its citizens are Catholic and most of the churches, of course, are Catholic. There are 2 small Baptist Churches in Chitre and, to our surprise, 4 Jehovah Witness' churches. Panama is very rooted in the occult, with fortune telling and palm reading advertisements and shops everywhere. The Panamanian people are very friendly and hospitable.

We only arrived 6 months ago and are still adjusting to our new lifestyle. It can be rough at times because electricity and water issues are common here. The

electricity goes out a few times a week. Sometimes it is out for 20 minutes and other times, up to 10 hours. The water

pressure is also a problem here in Chitre, and like the electricity, we go without water a few times a week.

Even with these temporary inconveniences we know we are exactly where the Lord wants us to be. He has been blessing and providing for us since we left Texas. We have seen souls saved and our children's ministry continues to grow. We are at the point where we can no longer fit in our living room. We have a longterm goal to open a multi-purpose building to use as a community center during the week and hold church services on Sunday mornings and Wednesday eve-



nings, but until this is possible, we are making arrangements to meet in our back yard after a few needed improvements. We were so blessed and grateful for the ABA voting to support us at the messenger meeting in Spokane, Washington,

and we are thankful that Harvest Oaks Baptist Church was able to attend and represent us. We look forward to being at the next meeting to personally meet and say "thank you" to everyone.

Leaving the known to move towards the unknown is often extremely difficult. Serving for seven years at the Berea Baptist Mission (church) in Del Rio, Texas allowed me to share in building both the material and spiritual aspects of the work. A congregation developed, creating friendships that will last for many years, if not forever. And it is difficult to say goodbye to this situation to move to a new mission field. I know that although I will continue living in Del Rio, I sadly will not be able to see these people on the regular basis that I have become accustomed to. Fortunately, God has whispered in our hearts: "This is the way, walk ye in it" (Isaiah 30:21) and we must go where He has chosen for us to minister.

Several years ago, we were able to acquire a piece of property in Cd. Acuña where we could continue to minister after Berea was organized into a New Testament Church. Construction began shortly after the acquisition of the land, but it eventually took a back seat to planning and preparing for Berea's organization. So, construction still hasn't been completed. However, we recently resumed construction of this building which is made up of a future auditorium, a kids' classroom, and bathrooms. So far, the walls for all three areas are up, but a lot of work still needs to be done for us to be able to use them. In the next few months, we will concentrate on the kid's classroom and bathrooms. This will give us enough space for us to begin having services on the property. I have met with the construction crew and made plans to begin pouring the concrete roof. All the forms have been set in place and (Lord willing) we hope to be able to pour the roof at the beginning of next week. The anticipation of what God will accomplish in this new mission work is what keeps us motivated to go in the path that He has determined. We pray that everything we accomplish in this new mission field will be to His glory!









MISSIONARY PILOT Gospel Flight





Introduction

I am Randall Gillespie, a Missionary Pilot called by God to spread the Gospel through aviation. My passion for aviation fuels my mission to share God's love and message of repentance. God's call leads us to reach the unreached in remote areas, establishing self-supporting New Testament Churches led by indigenous pastors. Bridging the gap between isolated communities is a privilege. I'm deeply thank-

ful to Jesus for this opportunity. We are sent out from Calvary Missionary Baptist Church in Orlando, FL. I'm undergoing advanced flight training and connecting with churches in the American Baptist Association to share our ministry and gain valuable experience during deputation. The training provides the skills to fly into some of the world's most challenging and inaccessible regions to deliver God's redemptive hope, humanitarian relief, and assistance.



In preparation for embarking as a Missionary Pilot, using the learned aviation skills and aircraft to serve humanitarian, religious, and charitable missions is vital. The goal will be to join an Organization like Mission Aviation Fellowship

(MAF), JAARS, or similar groups to reach people. The roles we will likely be involved in can be broadly categorized into three main areas: transportation, medical evacuation, and disaster relief.

• Missionary pilots are vital in providing transportation, medical evacuation, and disaster relief to isolated communities. They transport essential supplies like Bibles, food, medicine, and educational materials and provide medical assistance during emergencies. They also quickly deliver aid

and supplies to disaster-stricken areas, providing immediate relief to those in need.

Challenges Faced by Missionary Pilots to Get to the Field

While the work is essential, some not-so-typical challenges are encountered, and we'd ask you to join us in praying for the following things:

• Training and Costs: I'm on the path to becoming a Missionary Pilot, which requires rigorous and costly training. I currently hold a Private Pilot License and am actively pursuing Instrument Training. However, I must complete two immediate training goals: Instrument Rating and Commercial Pilot training. To start Commercial Training, I must have

250 hours of flight time; to qualify for fieldwork, I need a minimum of 500 hours. The advanced training and expenses total approximately \$55,995, covering ground schools, flight training, rentals, insurance, instructor fees, and FAA tests. Your prayers and support are greatly appreciated on this journey.

Challenges Faced by Missionary Pilots When on the _____ Field

- Hazardous Flying Conditions: Many missionary pilots operate in challenging environments with unpredictable weather conditions, rugged terrain, and high altitudes. These conditions require advanced piloting skills and constant vigilance.
- Security Concerns: Some regions where missionary pilots operate may be politically unstable or plagued by violence. This poses significant security risks to both pilots and the organizations they work with.

Impact on Communities

The work as a missionary pilot typically has a profound impact on the communities they serve:

- **Spiritual Transformation:** Sharing the Good News of Jesus Christ, positively affecting individuals, families, and entire communities.
- Access to Vital Services: They enable remote areas to access healthcare, education, and essential services, leading to better living conditions.
- Empowerment and Sustainable Development: Equipping isolated communities with the ability to take the Gospel from their location to others natively.



























FAITH BAPTIST CHURCH Sterlington, Louisiana

I met my wife through a mutual friend that attended the college and we began


we were serving Him while living in Florida.




It's amazing how God works. We started with gravy and loaves of bread in the back of a van. I have been using the same cooking pot for all these years and we've never run out, even when we served in excess of 350 people or more at a time. We have a big meal on Sunday mornings out on the street reaching many people, preaching the word, seeing souls saved, and inviting them to church. Thankfully, we have a 25 passenger bus that we received from Macedonia Missionary Service that enables us to bring people to church and take them where they need to be after services and classes.

We purchased a house a little over 7 years ago where we

are able to reach over 100 people a week and that has resulted in salvations, baptisms and changed the hearts of so many people. We have multiple Bible studies, classes, and dinners a week. We have helped many in the job application process, training programs, housing and provide a place for them to do laundry, take showers, and get new clothing and toiletries from our donation


